What kind of lost-ness is described in the story of the lost coin (verses 8-10)?

In what sense might the younger son be “lost”?

What is the most important thing to learn from these stories of the lost sheep, coin and lost son?

The story of the prodigal son emphasizes the father’s longing for his child’s return and joy at his homecoming. If you have wandered away far from your spiritual Father and home, we want you to know that God still loves you, misses you, and longs for your return. We do too!
